



The Tapestry Suite

The Main House - 1st floor

The Tapestry Suite was originally the drawing room of the main house and notably was Anne Boleyn's personal lounge during her courtship and marriage to Henry VIII. An armillary sphere, collared & chained silver boar, crowned key & scimitar carved into the plasterwork in the ceiling all indicate connections to the Percy family. The walls are adorned with three huge early 17th century Flemish tapestries giving the suite its name.

The majestic fireplace includes a remarkable Jacobean chimneypiece, splendidly carved with the figures of Ratio, Veritas and Victoria and an even more remarkable carved firestone mantel depicting the story of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden.
